Upgrade works are complete

The Broadbeach Bowls Club upgrade works commenced in November 2015 and were successfully completed in June 2016. The stage 2 works included completion of the dining hall refurbishment, upgrade and extension of the outdoor terrace and landscaping works.

The project has been delivered in time for the Broadbeach Bowls Club to host a series of high profile events including the Australia v Scotland Test Series; Blue Diamonds Pairs event; and the Australian Open.

Thank you for your patience throughout the construction phase and your cooperation that allowed us deliver this world-class upgrade more than 18 months ahead of the Gold Coast Commonwealth Games.

Other GC2018 preparations

While works at the Broadbeach Bowls Club are done and dusted, construction is continuing apace at numerous other GC2018 venues.

Work is progressing well at three new venues, the Coomera Indoor Sports Centre, the Carrara Sports and Leisure Centre and the Queensland State Velodrome.

Upgrades to the Gold Coast Hockey Centre and Gold Coast Cycle Centre are also moving along, while the first roof has gone on one of the eight story apartment buildings at Parklands, which will be home to 6,600 athletes and officials at Games time.
